

# When you meet a person with a visual disability

- Identify yourself when you approach a person who is blind. If a new person approaches, introduce that person.
- When you are talking with a person who is blind in a group of people, be sure to say the person's name so he or she knows you are speaking directly to them and not to someone else in the group.
- Face the person and speak directly to them. Use a normal tone of voice.
- Don't leave the person without saying goodbye and telling them that you are leaving.
